Dear Parents and Carers,

Despite the move to Level 2 restrictions we have had a very smooth start to Term 3. Thank you to all members of our community for your support in following the current guidelines.

For the benefit of community members who are not on our mailing list, this week's principal's report will contain the contents of the email that was distributed to parents and carers on Sunday 11th July. This information is correct as of 5:00pm Sunday (11/7/2021).

The NSW DoE has worked closely with NSW Health to develop a framework for COVID-19 response settings for schools. This framework includes 4 levels of restrictions:

Level 1: Students learning at school, with all activities occurring in a COVID-safe way

Level 2: Students learning at school, with non-essential visitors restricted from school sites, and certain activities modified to be COVID-safe; masks recommended indoors for all staff and all students in Year 7 and above (noting exemptions apply)

Level 3: Students learning at school, with non-essential visitors restricted from school sites, reduced mingling between student and year cohorts and restrictions on activities; masks mandatory for all staff and all students in Year 7 and above (noting exemptions apply)

Level 4: Students learning from home, but schools open for students and their families who need it. For those on school sites, masks mandatory for all staff and all students in Year 7 and above (noting exemptions apply). Gresford PS is returning to school in Term 3 under Level 2 restrictions.

I will endeavour to provide answers to Frequently Asked Questions below:

- Mask wearing is recommended (not required) indoors for staff. It is required for visitors. ٠
- All staff and visitors must scan Service NSW QR codes on arrival. ٠
- Scripture, ethics, external service providers (e.g. speech pathologists, occupational therapists), canteen ٠ workers, uniform shop volunteers, maintenance/building contractors are all able to come on site if following COVID Safe practices.
- Unfortunately, other volunteers (i.e. reading groups) are unable to enter the site.
- Assemblies will continue, visitors are unable to attend at this time.
- Only excursions in our Local Government Area are permitted and only if certain criteria are met.
- The Zone Athletics Carnival will proceed with one spectator per family (Week 3).
- Education Week community events will be postponed (previously planned for Week 3).
- Canberra Excursion postponed to Term 4 (previously planned for Week 7).
- Gresford PS has plentiful supplies of PPE, cleaning and hygiene products.
- Enhanced cleaning (including that of touch points during the day) will continue.
- There are no changes to group work, sharing items etc. However, students will be regularly reminded of hand hygiene.
- Community use of facilities (e.g. OHSC) outside of school hours can continue with COVID Safe practices.
- Parents/carers may enter the site for scheduled meetings with staff (following COVID Safe practices), however whenever possible, remote conferencing options will be offered and preferred.
- Front office procedures regarding students arriving late or departing early will be put into place to limit parents/carers entering site.

- Students being collected early will be escorted to the office/gate when a parent/carer arrives.
- Students arriving late go to the office and their reason for lateness recorded, student will continue to class on their own.
- Parents dropping off items (lunchboxes, etc.) for students should visit the front office for instruction.

At pick up and drop off parents and carers should:

- maintain physical distancing by avoiding gathering outside of school gates drop off and pick up on Glendonbrook Road please
- remain outside of school grounds
- follow mask-wearing requirements and sign in both the visitor log and the Service NSW QR code if required to enter the school.

I remind our community that students should not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms will be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result and are symptom-free. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

Although at the moment we are fortunate to be operating under Level 2 restrictions, all schools are working on contingency plans. Therefore, a survey will be sent to families next week to gather up to date information about access to technology for learning, supervision at home and likelihood of school attendance if it becomes necessary to move to Level 4 restrictions.

Congratulations to Ms McAlister on the birth of her son Clancy over the holidays. We would like to welcome Mrs Kylie Saxby to Gresford PS. She will be teaching 1/2 for the remainder of the year while Ms McAlister is on leave.

The School Infrastructure works have now been completed. The old roof tiles have been removed, and replaced with colour bond roofing. There are new ceilings in the 3/4, 5/6 classrooms and computer room. There are new LED lights and fans in both classrooms. The air conditioner in 5/6 has been replaced. New blinds will be put in both classrooms.





This term the school is trialling Maths Groups on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays. This is to tailor to students' needs. The groups will be flexible depending on topics and areas that different students need more support in. The teachers are working collaboratively across all groups to plan and teach focus areas.

Gresford PS has made it into the Game Changer competition. They will be competing shortly in virtual heats. The team will pitch their ideas live to a judging panel using a design thinking approach to solve complex problems. We wish the students competing great success.

This term Gresford PS has introduced the Attendance House. Each week any student who has been at school for the entire week will put a ping-pong ball into the house. If the school reaches the predetermind line by the end of term there will be a class prize for one afternoon. This is to promote attendance. We are currently at 92.6% and are aiming for 95%.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Re: Skool Loop Notifications

It has come to my attention that some families are not receiving notifications on the Skool Loop app.

There are often a few reasons that phones do not receive the alert.

- If you are in the app when the notice is sent, it does not want to 1 send an alert as you are already in the app to see the message that has been sent.
- 2. If the app or the user's phone is not up to date, then you may not receive the notice as the phone's current software cannot handle the request.
- 3. The user's phone may have notifications switched off. To fix this go into settings - Apps/notifications - and choose to allow.
- 4. The Phone may be too old. Some phones such as the iPhone 5 are now too old to receive push notifications as the software that the app runs on is newer than what is available for that phone.
- 5. To join a group in notices - go into the notices tile on the interface of your school app and touch the three small bars on the top right-hand side, this will show you the groups the school have made.
